## **Key Views**

#### 1. Introduction

To ensure a clear and thorough methodology to assess Key Views (KV) into and out of the village a number of criteria has been devised to which suggested views have been assessed:

- Key views must be accessible by the public (i.e. views from public roads, footpaths or green spaces)
- Key views should show a range of physical (natural or man-made) features and an expanse of the parish not one particular object unless this is a building of particular historic importance
- Key views should possess at least one of the following values: aesthetic, historical, recreational, biodiversity or tranquillity

#### 2. Features Specific to Burghclere

One of the distinctive features of Burghclere Parish is the visual connectivity with the surrounding landscape from settlements and public rights of way (ROW). Public consultation with parishioners has highlighted that local residents highly value Burghclere's landscape setting and feel that environmental considerations are crucial for development in the area.

The North Wessex Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (NWD AONB) which crosses the south of the Parish presents the village and surrounding areas with far reaching views over the rural landscape from Beacon Hill to Ladle Hill and Watership Down all the way to Hannington. The views in and around Burghclere have been identified as important by the vast majority of local residents.




Figure B: Map of Key Views in Burghclere Parish

#### 3. Methodology

Important views as recognized in the Burghclere Village Design Statement (2002) formed the basis for the Key View Review 2018/2019. These previously identified views, together with new suggested KVs brought forward by members of the Steering Group as well as through public consultation were assessed to the above criteria. This task required considerable field and map surveys to ensure that the above criteria were met. In the process of assessment some new KVs were identified and some previous KVs were removed. Due to growth of trees and hedges these were no longer visible from a public right of way (ROW).




Figure C: Map of Key Views in Burghclere Village




Figure D: Map of Key Views in Burghclere Parish North




Figure E: Map of Key Views in Burghclere Parish South of Village




Figure F: Map of Key Views in Burghclere Parish South
