Business Needs Survey Report

- 1. The Burghclere Neighbourhood Development Plan proposal for 15 houses at the southern end of the village is considering the inclusion of a Flexible Shared Workspace to included office, hot desk, meeting and therapy spaces for small business owners, freelancers, homeworkers and community groups.
- 2. With over 60 businesses registered in the parish alone, and many more in the surrounding areas, we believe there is potential to create a great workspace in the local area. This survey was conducted to get feedback to see if our proposal would have the support needed to take the project forward.
- 3. We prepared a short survey in conjunction with the Rural Business Hub, a shared workspace in Hurstbourne Tarrant, and shared it on social media platforms including the local Nextdoor.com website to get as fair a representation as possible for feedback on the proposal.
- 4. The survey was conducted over a two week period from 17 -31st October and we received 40 responses. The results are as follows:

"Important that any new build is part of the Neighbourhood Plan proposal and not linked to the Falcon Development proposals"

"Shared work spaces are OK BUT ONLY IF they are provided as part of the AGREED BURCHLERE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN and not forced into a location that the majority of the villagers are opposed to. The Neighbourhood Plan proposes housing development with a business hub on the edge of the village by the A34 Junction with access to the M4. This would not only be convenient to householders and businesses and their visitors but would prevent business traffic going through the village. The development of business hubs and their use must recognise the will of the village."

Summary

The results of the Shared Workspace Survey have revealed that 88% of those that responded anticipate using such a facility ranging from full time usage to a few times each year. The majority of interest is in a meeting room facility (47%) but also in a therapy or treatment room and using a shared workspace for craft workshops, training and hot desk working. 77% of the respondents are from Burghclere and the surrounding districts which leads us to conclude that there is local support, and from those living further afield, for a shared workspace facility to be included in the Neighbourhood Plan scheme.
